

PLANTS @ CEDERKLOOF: BELOVED TREES



WIDDRINGTONIA CEDARBERGENSIS Clanwilliam cedar. We have been planting the trees that lent their name to the mountain range for the past 3 years and some have been growing very well.



SALIX MUCRONATA subsp. *hirsuta*: Cape Willow; Endemic to the Olifants River Catchment area. These trees were hidden under aliens until we removed the aliens that covered them.



OLEA EUROPAEA africana: Olien Hout, Wild Olive. These beloved and ecologically and culturally very important trees are growing wild in the stream beds and gullies.



ILEX MITIS Cape Holly
These beautiful tall trees has red new growth.



PODOARPUS LATIFOLIUS Geelhout
Although these trees are indigenous to the gullies and stream beds, all ours are planted in the gardens.



BUDDLEJA SALVIFOLIA Butterfly bush
great for screening and attracting insects, butterflies and birds.



RAPANEA MELANOPHLOEOS Kaapse Boekenhout; Cape Beech. They are slow growing in this area, tall and elegant.



DODONEA ANGUSTAFOLIA Sandolien, Sand Olive. The tall shrubs small trees, grow wild and fast perfect for privacy and shelters for birds and much needed shade.



HARPEPHYLLUM CAFFRUM Wilde Pruim, Wild plum easily identified by the whirling leaves at the branch terminus. This tree is hardy and fast growing.
